Course Outline:

The objective of this course is to use the tools of microeconomic analysis, institutional economics, and econometrics, to understand energy markets. Course content will focus on empirical studies of the energy business including natural gas markets, crude oil markets, gasoline markets, electricity markets, and coal markets.

Students enrolled in this course are expected to be familiar with microeconomic theory at the level of Silberberg and Suen?s *The Structure of Economics: A Mathematical Analysis* and econometrics at the level of Jack Johnston?s *Econometric*. In other words, you don?t have to know how to analyse a differentiable game or use the Gibbs sampler. But you might learn these things too.
