Course Outline: Economics 611 focuses on learning techniques that can be applied to produce original research and to critically analyze existing research in the field of public economics. The course will emphasize empirical research and will contain a discussion of relevant econometric techniques used in public economics. The course aims to give students a broad overview of this growing field and to bring them to the research frontier.

The course covers material on taxation, public expenditures and social insurance. I will provide a more detailed course outline on the first day of class. Familiarity with Stata or another statistical software is required.
