Calculators WILL NOT be allowed during the writing of tests or final examinations.

The two (2) hour Registrar scheduled final examination will be held in a gymnasium during the final examination period.

Tests and exams may involve multiple choice questions.

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Notes:

- The midterm examinations will be held in class on dates to be announced. THERE WILL BE NO MAKEUP OR DEFERRED EXAMINATIONS under any circumstances, nor may the examinations be written early. Students unable to write the examination because of documented illness, family emergency or religious observance will have the weight shifted to the final examination; otherwise a grade of zero will be assigned.
- Should the writing of a midterm examination <u>for an entire lecture section</u> become impossible due to <u>events</u> <u>beyond the control of the instructor</u> (such as, and not exclusively consisting of: inclement weather, instructor?s illness, unavailable facilities, or other "acts of fate") the midterm examination will be written one week later.
- Students seeking reappraisal of a piece of graded term work (term paper, essay, etc.) should discuss their work with the Instructor within two weeks of the work being returned to the class.
