Course Description: This course focuses on fluctuations in a nation's level of economic activity, and their impacts on the economic well-being of citizens.

Course Objectives/Learning Outcomes: This course will enable students to understand macroeconomic issues that arise in daily life. It will also provide basic information for students who plan to enroll in Economics 303 at a later date.
