### **Course Outline:**

This course introduces students to the application of mathematical methods in economic theory. Techniques discussed include elementary algebra, linear algebra, single and multivariable calculus, optimization (unconstrained, equality constrained, inequality constrained, and dynamic), equilibrium analysis, comparative static analysis, differential and difference equations, and analysis and optimization of dynamical systems. Applications from microeconomic and macroeconomic theory and econometrics are used to illustrate concepts throughout the course.
