The course overviews some advanced methods for modeling a dynamic economic environment with uncertainties, heterogeneous agents, and market friction.

Grade Determination and Final Examination Details:

Student performance will be evaluated through a collection of assignments (10%) and two exams (90%). The second exam will be held during the final exam period. Assignments and exams are marked on a numerical (percentage) basis and converted to letter grades. The course grade is then calculated using the weights indicated above.
